




WHO IS NC EAST ALLIANCE






Cost of Living Comparison

Across the Alliance's 29 county service area, eastern North Carolina has the most contiguous Tier One counties in the state.








POPULATION CHANGE: 2020-23




UNEMPLOYMENT RATE: 2023
