






Hyster-Yale's Global Footprint

















Operational Actions Taken in Response to COVID-19



- > Procedures Implemented To Limit Employee's Exposure To COVID-19
- Carefully Managing Shipments, Backlog And Lead Times To Match Market Conditions While Also Maintaining Adequate Production Levels And Minimal Open Production Slots
- ➤ Focused On Adapting Production Levels Quickly To Market Changes And Working Closely With Suppliers To Help Ensure Appropriate Component Supply Levels











Supply Chain Impact



- Phase 1: Initial Focus On Asian Suppliers
 - Communication And Timing
 - Benefit Of Chinese New Year
- > Phase 2: Risk Assessments Quickly Shifted To European Supply Base
 - Country-Wide Shutdowns
 - Little Time To Respond And Very Limited Transportation Options
- Phase 3: Rapid Spread Throughout North America
 - Balance Impact To Supply Base Along With Impact To Our Own Operations
 - Difficult To Navigate The State-By-State And City-By-City Protocols

- Implemented Corrective Actions From 2011 Japan Earthquake And Tsunami
- Know Your Supply And Logistics Network, Quickly Identify Suppliers And Logistics Nodes In Impacted Regions
- Risk Mitigation: Safety Stock, VMI's, Alternative Sources, Premium Transportation

- Internal Stakeholders Need Clear And Accurate Assessment Of Situation
- External Supply And Logistics Partners
